SPECIAL AWARDS

OREGON POLL-ETTES — A trophy awarded for the best individual polled Hereford breeding or market animal. Judged 60 percent placing of animals in respective classes. (Animals must be naturally polled; if scars are present, they must not have been tampered with.) 20 percent exhibitor's herdsmanship, 20 percent exhibitor's showmanship & sportsmanship. (A breeding animal must have proper registration papers & be registered in the exhibitor's name. Exhibitors of steers must submit proof of registry of sire or dam.)

WESTERN STATES ANGUS AUXILIARY, 11261 Pioneer Rd., Oakdale, Calif. 95361 — will award a silver trophy to the outstanding FFA Angus exhibitor. Selection to be based on show ring placings of individual animals, placings in showmanship & in cooperation with Fair management. Open to exhibitors with one or more breeding and-or market animals. The purpose of this award is the promotion of the Angus breed. Winning of the Auxiliary trophy in previous years shall not exclude the exhibitor from winning it again.
