BMCC placement test hours announced

Special testing times have been established at the Blue Mountain Community College Counseling Center for students planning to enter the college this fall who have not yet taken the college's placement test.

The test is offered Monday through Thursday at 8:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m., 1 p.m., and 3 p.m. The four-part test includes sections in the areas of mathematics, reading, vocabulary and writing.

Placement test results are used by the student's advisor to place the student in the appropriate level of math and English classes. No student applying to Blue Mountain is turned away based on the results of this test.

Students taking the test need to allow about an hour and a half to complete it. Following the test, a BMCC counselor will be available to discuss the student's educational plans with him or her.

The student will then be assigned an advisor and given a registration appointment with that advisor. Blue Mountain will be following the registration procedure instituted last fall where registration will run three days in the fall.

Entering and returning students will see their advisor, by appointment, on one of the days for help in building their schedule.

Fall term registration at Blue Mountain is set for Sept. 22 through 24. Classes begin Monday, Sept. 28.

Council sends mobile home rezoning request to planners

The Heppner City Council sent back to the planning commission a request last Thursday that mobile homes be allowed on commercially zoned lots in the city of Heppner.

The request came from Jim Lankford, who told the council he wished to be able to place a mobile home on a commercial lot in town, not allowed in present zoning rules.

The city planning commission had earlier given its ok to the rule change, however, the council sent back the request asking that commercial lots one block east and west of main street be excluded from the proposed rule change.

Under the proposed change mobile homes would be allowed in commercial zones only with a conditional use permit approved by the planning commission.

One main area the council was concerned with is Linden Way near the edge of town.

The council felt commercially zoned property along that street was suitable for mobile homes, but felt downtown commercial property was not.

Under the planning commission recommendation sent to the council, mobile homes would have been allowed on any commercial lot in the city.

In other business, the council:

- sold a four-inch water flow meter no longer needed by the city to Carl Thorpe.

Co. officials meet with AOC to discuss highway funds

Morrow County was represented by Judge Donald McEligott and Donald Briggs, Public Works director, at meetings with the Association of Oregon Counties (AOC) in Salem on Thursday and Friday, July 30 and 31.

The AOC has access to Federal Forest Highway funding to be made available to Oregon counties. Morrow County is one of thirteen Oregon counties who have requested funding for specific projects.

Application for 1.5 million dollars in project funds was made to widen and improve the portion of Willow Creek road between North Fork and Cutsforth Park.

At the close of Thursday's meeting the AOC Technical

Advisory Committee prioritized the thirteen projects for funding consideration placing Morrow County as fifth priority. The AOC Transportation and Parks Committee reviewed the Technical Advisory Committee's recommendations favorably on Friday.

The final recommended priority list of proposed projects will be submitted to the AOC board of directors in August and the board's recommendations will be submitted to the Tri-Agency meeting of the U.S. Forest Service, Federal Highway Administration and Oregon Department of Transportation on September 9, 1981. A final decision on which projects will be funded will be made at that time.
