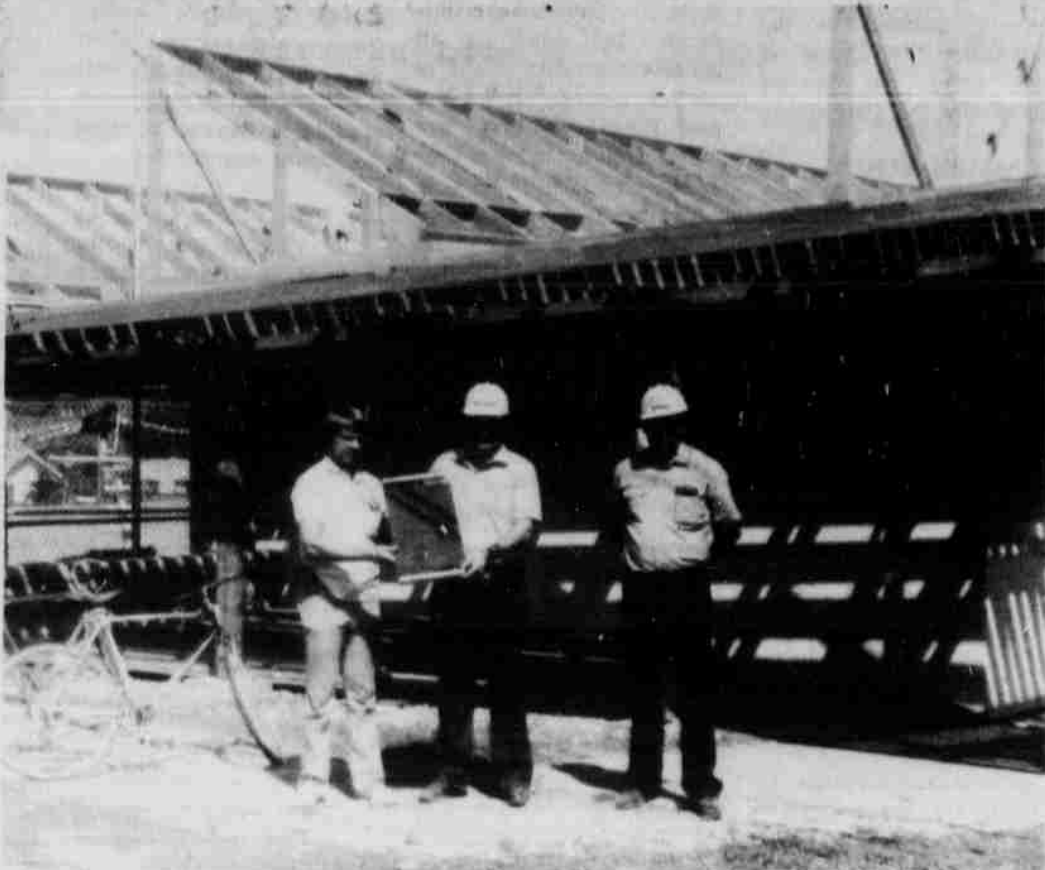


Basic construction completed on Heppner solar heat project

Jean Bennett was elected chairman of the Morrow Co. School District board of directors at its July meeting. She

replaced Kenneth Broadbent. Jerry McElligott was elected vice-chairman for 1981-82.

School board opts for separate tax base, budget elections

The Morrow County School Board voted Monday night to hold separate tax base and budget elections in the school district next year.

Under Oregon State law the district is required to ask voters for a new tax base next year, and the board had the option of combining that request with the regular 1982-83 operating budget.

Superintendent Matt Doherty told the board the district is operating with a 1916 tax base of "about

\$500,000." The base is the amount the district can tax without a vote of the people.

The board voted to hold the regular school operating levy first, on the last Tuesday in March, and hold the tax base election later, on the third Tuesday in May.

Boardmembers indicated the separate vote would give voters a clearer voice on whether or not they wanted a new base in the district.

In other business, the board

decided not to adopt a resolution asking for a freeze on nuclear arms production, and the immediate start of nuclear arms negotiations with the Soviet Union. The Portland school district had adopted such a resolution, and had asked the Morrow County School District to do the same.

A draft of the resolution would have been sent to the President of the United States and each member of Oregon's Congressional Delegation.
