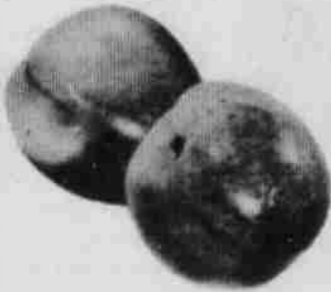

Ammonia Detergent Solution, Acids, fruit juices, and many dyes found in beverages, foods and medicines are removed by an ammonia detergent solution. To a cup of lukewarm water, add 1/2 teaspoon of a neutral, powder, non-bleaching, laundry detergent and a teaspoon of household ammonia. Pretesting is very important and, if the carpet dyes bleed, do not use this solution. If it tests safe, apply small amounts and blot. Repeat until all the stain is removed. If some stain remains, go to Step 6.
