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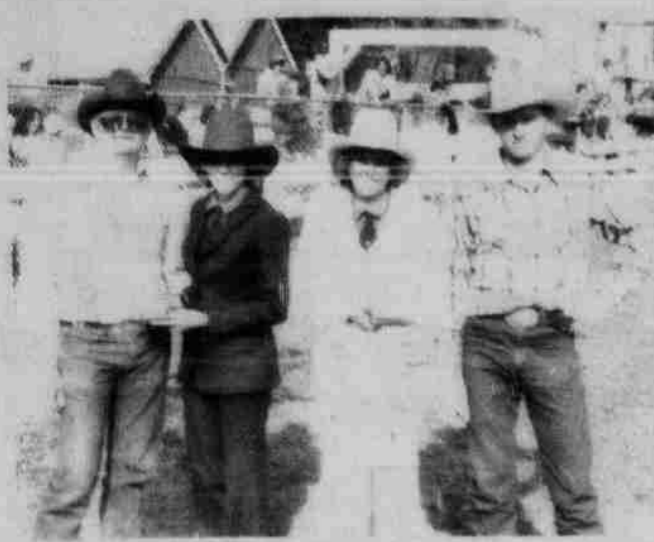
# Wheat disease experts slate meeting Sept. 3

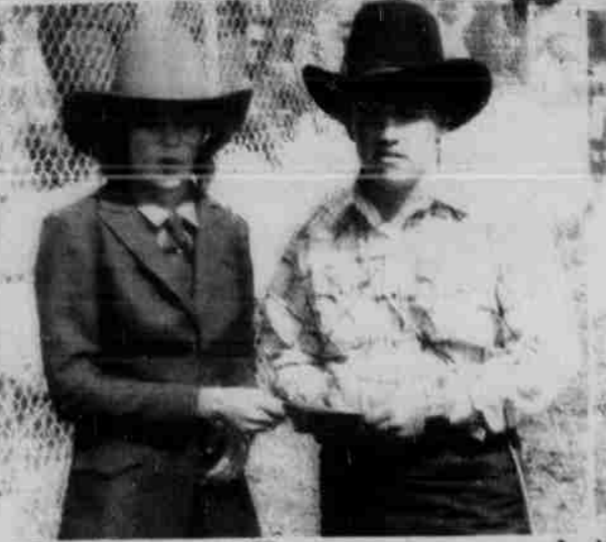
Some of the most knowledgeable wheat disease experts in the Northwest will be meeting with wheat growers on Thursday, September 3, at 7:30 p.m. in Thompson Hall at the Umatilla County Fairgrounds in Hermiston. Wheat growers are encouraged to attend.

Take-all yellow dwarf virus, and stripe rust are but a few of the diseases affecting wheat in our area and they pose a serious threat to wheat production. Dr. Bob Powelson, Extension plant pathologist from OSU, will talk about the latest take-all research. Paul Rasmussen and Vance Pumphrey from the Columbia Basin Ag Research Center in Pendleton, will present findings from take-all research conducted in our area this summer. The scientists will also discuss yellow dwarf virus, stripe rust, and any other disease topics you might have questions about.

The meeting will be informal with plenty of opportunity for discussion. Planting time is upon us and many of the wheat disease problems you'll face and the methods of control will be discussed.

## Dam Report

The following report has been released from the Willow Creek resident office of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers:

Preparation of work has started on the water storage tank and Chase Street water main. Materials are arriving on the site on a daily basis. Poles and conductors are being installed on the power

facility relocation. The relocated segment of telephone lines and facilities along lower Willow Creek to the Balm Fork connection is operational. Excavation and embankment operations continue on the Willow Creek Road, reservoir waterline, and bridges. Concrete work on Willow Creek abutment No. 1 and Pier No. 2 foundation has begun.
