

SHERIFF'S REPORT

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner handled the following calls over the past week:

On Sept. 14 a fire was reported at the Kinzua Corp. mill in Heppner in the plainer building. The Heppner Fire Dept. responded to the call.
