COURT AT THE REGULAR MEETING OF OCTOBER 14, 1981 ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE BY UNANIMOUS VOTE UNDER EMERGENCY PROCEDURE AS AUTHORIZED BY ORS 203.045:

Justice Court(Ordinance)
ORDINANCE NO. MC-C4

WHEREAS ORS 51.020 invests county courts with the authority to set off and establish or modify justice of peace districts and,

WHEREAS the Justice of the Peace of the fifth district has submitted his resignation which shall become effective October 31, 1981, and

WHEREAS consolidation of the Morrow County Justice Court Districts into one district would provide substantial cost savings to the people of Morrow County, and

WHEREAS more efficient and complete justice can be administered by a unified Morrow County Justice Court and

WHEREAS the Umatilla - Morrow County District Court is available for services formerly provided exclusively by the justice courts.

The County Court of Morrow County ordains as follows:

Section 1 The fifth District Justice Court for Morrow County and the sixth District Justice Court for Morrow County are hereby consolidated into one justice court which shall be known as the Justice Court for Morrow County.

Section 2 The Justice of the Peace for the Justice Court for Morrow County shall sit at the Court House Annex in Irrigon, Oregon for two days per week and shall sit at the Morrow County Courthouse for two days per week.

Section 3 The Justice of the Peace for Morrow County shall establish and maintain a traffic violations bureau in the Morrow County Courthouse Annex which shall have a clerk available during regular working

hours as established by the Morrow County Personnel policy.

Section 4 The clerk of the violations bureau shall be bonded in the same manner as a deputy county clerk.

Section 5 In as much as it is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Morrow County that this ordinance have effect November 1, 1981,

and emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from November 1, 1981, after its passage and approval.

Passed by the Court and approved this 14 day of October, 1981.

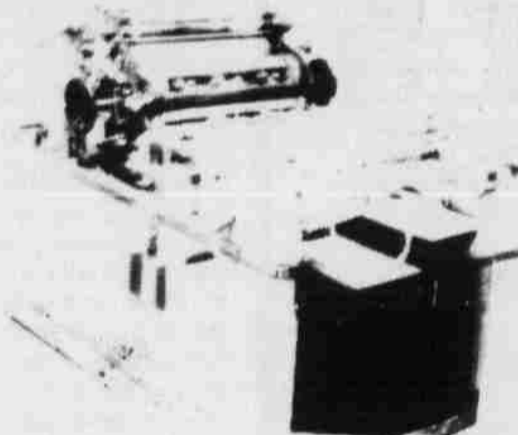
