**Santa's Workshop - A G-T holiday feature**

(Editor's note: Beginning Thanksgiving week and continuing through the December 24 issue, the G-T will publish Santa's Workshop as a special holiday feature for our readers. Each week a G-T staff member will give instructions to make a Christmas ornament or craft. Some projects will be primarily for children, others are for children and adults.

From us to you, Happy Holidays.

Instructions for making a Christmas Chain appeared in the "Good Housekeeping" magazine Christmas issue about 13 years ago. My mother showed me how to get started and I had a lot of fun making it. We hung the chain on the fireplace hearth and it has been hung there each year since.

Materials needed: aluminum foil, a pencil and scissors.

Instructions:

1. Cut foil into 1 1/2 x 6 or 7 inch strips.
2. Roll foil strip around pencil and carefully remove rolled foil from pencil.
3. Pinch and squeeze the rounded foil strip to compact the width of the strip, leaving one end open (cone shaped). Place compressed end into open end and pinch shut.
4. Continue making links and joining them together as you go until desired length is achieved.

The finished chain may be hung, as my family has, on a fireplace hearth or on a Christmas tree, in an entry way or just about anywhere.

The chain is fun for kids to make and keeps well over the years. If a link comes apart and the chain breaks, just get out the foil and make a repair.



**ROAD REPORT**

The Morrow County Public Works Dept. has released the following work report for the week ending November 21:

During the past week the county road crew bladed and graveled Nolan Road, Belle Ranch Road, Dee Cox Road, Valby Road, Don Turner Road and Strawberry East.

Bladed only were: Killkeny Road, S. Wagonblast, Juniper, No. 677, Brenner Canyon and Dolven Road.

Fill material and gravel were used on the Bergstrom-Carlson Road.

A short section of Upper Rhea Creek Road was straightened and widened with the D7 Cat. The D6 was used to clean the channel of Willow Creek, where the water washes onto the road right-of-way.

Signs and reflectors were replaced on Wilson Road and the Bombing Range Road.

Rock walls were rebuilt at culvert ends on the Nolan Road.

Construction of the Division Street Bridge in Irrigon is near completion. The deck will be paved this week and will be open to traffic by December 1.

Anson Wright and Cutsforth parks were closed on Monday, November 23.

The crusher on Clarks Canyon Road has been operating periodically this past week.

The mechanics have been preparing snow removal equipment for the icy, snowy days ahead.
