Christmas mailing tips from Heppner post master

With Christmas mailing season just ahead, Heppner Postmaster Ken Nairns is offering tips for customers to assure that their cards and packages arrive on time and in good shape.

In addition to shopping and mailing early, customers are urged to properly address cards and packages with the name, street number and name (or post office box number), and the city, state and ZIP Code reserved for the last line.

"It is also a good idea to put a slip of paper with the recipient's name and address and your return address inside parcels, and be sure the addressing on the outside of the parcel includes your return address and ZIP Code," Nairns says.

Customers are also reminded to check the size of their envelopes before mailing Christmas and other holiday cards. Letter size standards require that envelopes be at least three and one half inches high and five inches long to be accepted for mailing.

The Postal Service is also asking customers to put an ounce of extra care into preparing parcel post and other packages for mailing. Parcels will arrive at their intended destination in good shape if mailers will follow a few simple suggestions:

CUSHION: Make sure contents are well-cushioned and there is no empty space in the box. Use crumpled newspaper around the item-including all sides, top and bottom. Commercially available foam shells or air-pocket padding also make good cushioning materials.

DON'T OVERWRAP: Just use your carton. Brown paper and twine cord are not necessary. Paper can rip, and twine can become entangled with processing equipment.

SEAL PROPERLY: Close your parcel with one of the three recommended types of tape: pressure sensitive, nylon-reinforced kraft paper, or glass-reinforced pressure sensitive.

AVOID SMUDGES: Use smudge-proof ink for your addressing.

LOCATE ADDRESSES PROPERLY: Put the recipient's address in the lower right portion of the container. Put your return address in the upper left hand corner. Remove all other labels from the box.

USE ZIP CODES: Be sure to include the ZIP Code in both the recipient's and your return address.

TIME IT RIGHT: Mail early in the month and early in the day. This will help you avoid the rush.

USE THE RIGHT SERVICE: Irreplaceable items, cash and other valuables should be sent by registered mail.

IF YOU RUN OUT OF TIME: Priority Mail affords First-Class handling for packages weighing over 12 ounces and up to 70 pounds. Priority Mail can be sent from any post office, station or branch or through rural carriers to any address in the U.S. Priority Mail can even be used for foreign mailings.

BMCC budget committee sets 1982 election dates

The Blue Mountain Community College budget committee, meeting in joint session with the college board, set March 30, 1982 as the date for an operating budget levy election at their Nov. 18 meeting.

Since BMCC has no tax base, the residents of Morrow and Umatilla counties must vote on the entire tax levy each year. Besides setting an operating levy election date, the budget committee set May 18, 1982 as the tentative date for a tax base election.

State law requires that taxing districts without a tax base present the question of such a base to the voters every two years. Tax base elections may only be scheduled for the May date or on Nov. 2, 1982.

College President Ron Daniels reported to the committee that each tax election held by the college costs about \$5,000. He added that state election regulations require board member elections to be held on election day other than the one in May. Daniels concluded that regardless of the board's decision on elections, the college would have to hold a minimum of two elections this spring—one for the man-

dated tax base election and another one to elect new board members.

In other business, the budget committee heard a report from Daniels on monetary resources available to the college. The president suggested a plan whereby cash carryover fluctuations might be stabilized.

Allan Pinkerton, formerly of Helix and now of Pendleton, was re-elected to the position of budget committee chairman. Ida Reeser, budget committee member from Pilot Rock, was named secretary at the meeting also.

Other members of the college's budget committee include: Doug Harper, Helix; Ralph Skoubo, Boardman; Terry Lindell, Pendleton; and Hugh Irwin, Milton-Freewater.
