Spray's full-court press at the outset pressured Heppner into many of its 31 turnovers

and enabled the Eagles to pull away for an easy victory.

The Mustangs committed 24 fouls to eight for Spray, and allowed the visitors to shoot 25 more free throws. Spray was 18-for-31 at the foul line, while the Mustangs were 2-for-6.

Jay Hayes led Heppner in scoring with seven points, followed by Sid Kennedy with six, Marty Britt four, Rod Cole four, Greg Orr two, Craig Miles two, Archie Lucas two, and Shane Laughlin one.

Laughlin grabbed six rebounds and Orr dealt out four

assists.

Janice Healy, Miss Rodeo Oregon, is among the 48 contestants competing for the title of Miss Rodeo America during the 27th annual pageant in Oklahoma City, December 1 through 6.

She is the daughter of Bill and Kathryn Healy of Heppner.

Forty-seven states and one Canadian province are represented in the pageant, which opened December 1 with a reception at Heritage Place in Oklahoma City, said a pageant spokesperson.

During the reception, each contestant was presented three Resistol hats. Resistol, manufactured by Resistol Hats of Garland, Texas, is the official hat of the Miss Rodeo America pageant. Miss Rodeo America contestants are judged during the six-day event on western appearance, personality and overall horsemanship.

The horsemanship judging, patterned after the classes and rules of the American Quarter Horse Association, separates Miss Rodeo America from other pageants for women, the spokesperson continued. The Miss Rodeo America pageant began in 1955 as a three-day event with 10 participants. It has grown to be one of the top pageants for young women in the country.

To compete for the title of America's all-around horsewoman, contestants must be single, age 18 to 24, and have won their state title during a pageant held in conjunction with a state rodeo. The reigning 1981 Miss Rodeo America is Kathleen "Kathy" Martin, of Pueblo, Colorado. The 1982 Miss Rodeo America was to be named during the pageant finals Sunday, December 6 in the State Fair Arena.
