

Mustangs come away with two more in win column



Bier goes high for two against Condon.

The Heppner Mustang varsity team came away with two more in the win column last weekend, after defeating Condon 81-60, at Condon Dec. 11, and 71-57 in a rematch at Heppner Dec. 12.

"We beat them mainly by dominating the boards," said Mustang Coach Dale Holland.

And indeed they did control the backboards. In game number one played at Condon, the Mustangs out-rebounded the Blue Devils more than two to one, 71 to 30, with forward Dorian Forrar and guard Dale Holland both gathering 12 apiece. Jeff Orr and Don Lott brought in 11 rebounds each.

Heppner did very well in the scoring department too in the first game, making 37 of 79 attempts from the field for a 47 percent shooting average.

"We did very well on our fast break," Holland said of both games. "We dominated the boards and got the ball out well on the outlet pass."

Mustangs jumped out to an 18 to 8 lead at the end of the first quarter, and it was never really close after that.

Dorian Forrar scored 12 of his team high 22 points in the first quarter to pace the Heppner squad.

At the end of the half the Mustangs lead 38 to 21, and at the end of the third period they were up 63 to 37.

In the second game with Condon, Heppner again dominated play on the backboards, and ran their fast break well to come away with the victory, this time 71 to 57. The game was played in Heppner Dec. 12.

"Condon played a better game when they came here," said Head Coach Dale Holland.

The Blue Devils played good enough to lead the Mustangs 14 to 13 at the end of the first period.

"We pulled away in the second half, mainly because of

The score at the end of the half was 32 to 23 in favor of the Mustangs.

"Don Lott scored nine of his 20 points in the third quarter. We put the game out of reach in the third quarter," said Holland. The score was 38 to 52 in favor of the Mustangs at the end of the third period.

Although Heppner looked good in rebounding and offense in both games, Holland says they can still use a little more improvement on defense.

"I think we could have played better defense in both games."

Frank Bowman was high scorer again for Condon in the second game, racking up a total of 25 points. Joe Snyder was second for the Blue Devils with 11 points.

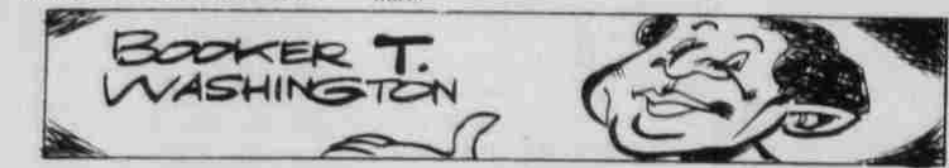
