Please CARE

To the editor:
With the bitter cold magnifying the suffering of the Polish people standing in long food lines, CARE, the international aid and development organization, guarantees delivery of food packages to those in greatest need: the elderly, infants, and pregnant and nursing women.
Dr. Philip Johnston, the Executive Director of CARE, recently returned from Poland where top officials assured him that CARE will be permitted to continue monitoring the distribution of the

food packages. "CARE has already distributed more than 100,000 23-pound food packages, and our staff members make spotcheck visits to the beneficiary's homes to make sure that the food is going to the neediest people," Dr. Johnston said.
"We are gearing up to provide food for approximately two million people each day, but we can only supply as many packages as funds permit. CARE must collect special funds to distribute more packages in Poland because we cannot cutback

our on-going food, self-help development, and disaster relief programs in 37 developing countries in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Middle East," Dr. Johnston said.
CARE's performance over the past years since "CARE package" became a household word soon after WWII, lends credibility to its guarantee of food delivery to the people of Poland.
The critical plight of the

Polish people calls for a continuing response by compassionate Americans. We urge you to send generous donations for the packages, which cost \$12 each for 23 pounds of nourishing food.
