Dorian Forrar, Heppner's outstanding forward, just seems to be unstoppable this year, as he poured in 22 points, grabbed 13 rebounds and dished out four assists in Heppner's eleventh straight win of the season. The victory left the boys in blue undefeated for both the season and in

league play.

Heppner jumped on Stanfield early, building an 11 - 0 lead in the first quarter, and the Mustangs never looked back. The closest Stanfield came was 34 - 30 in the third quarter.

"They made a run at us in the third quarter," said Heppner Coach Dale Holland. "They hit everything they put up."

But thanks to a fourth

quarter scoring spurt by Doug Holland, and good rounded play from the rest of the club, the Mustangs were able to come out on top.

"Don Lott played a good game," said Holland pointing out Lott's eight assists, and 11 rebounds, and eight points.

"Dorian Forrar had a good second half, and Holland had eight of his 12 points in the fourth quarter," the coach added.

"I was pleased with our passing and ball handling, we had lots of assists," Holland commented on the performance of his club. "I thought we played pretty good defense too, although we got a little lax in the second half."

Looking ahead to this weekend, Holland said it could be rough for the Mustangs.

Heppner faces Umatilla Friday, and Wahtonka Saturday, both are away games. "We've got a tough weekend coming up," Holland stated.
