

## Mustangs bounce back, down Sherman

But the real story of the game was the Mustang guard's ability to control the game. "(Doug) Holland and (Don) Lott dominated the game," said Holland. Doug Holland scored a season high 26 points in the Sherman contest.

"We beat them on the boards against a bigger ball club. And we played a much better ball game all around," Holland said.

The Mustangs were in the game until the middle of the third quarter when the Rockets pulled away.

Heppner's offense was dealt a setback in the third period when the Mustangs' 6'5" center Robert Bier went down in a pile and had to leave the game with a knee injury.

Bier's injury apparently isn't serious. He suffered a bruise under the knee cap which may hold him to limited play in this weekend's games.

A big factor in the loss was also the Mustang's inability to dominate the boards, as they have in the past.

"Pilot Rock outrebounded us," Holland said, "and they are the only team to do that this year." Pilot Rock pulled down 40 rebounds in the contest, while the Mustangs managed only 36.

The Mustangs' Dorian Forrar had another good offensive game, scoring 26 points, while the only other Heppner player to score in double figures was Bier with 12, before leaving the game with injury.
