NOTICE OF SERVICE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX WARRANTS

NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to ORS 311.615 of the service of Personal Property Tax Warrants upon the following listed tax payers. Payment of the following listed delinquent taxes with interest and costs of service must be made by March 15, 1982 or said warrants shall be filed with the County Clerk of Morrow County, Oregon, to be entered in the judgment docket of said county shall become a lien upon the title to any interest in real property owned by the person against whom the warrant is issued, and the taxes on personal property embraced in the warrant with interest, penalties and costs applicable thereto, shall continue as a lien on all the personal property of the person assessed as otherwise provided by law. The effect shall be the same as though the people of the county had recovered the judgment against the person charged for the full amount of the delinquent tax covered by the warrant together with interest thereon and cost as provided by law.

 The course will include a 3.1 mile and a 6.2 mile easy, slight down hill run, said a spokesperson. The proceeds of the run will benefit the Heppner Swimming Pool solar heating project, already in its early stages of completion. Rolling Hills Run T-shirts and certificates will be awarded to all finishers, she added. Trophies will be awarded to the oldest and youngest finishers overall. Trophies will also be awarded to the first place male and female finishers in the 6.2 run. First, second and third place ribbons will also be awarded in the age divisions in the 6.2 mile run.
 The run will begin at 7:30 a.m. Runners will meet at Heppner Elementary School by 12:30 p.m. to be bused to the starting point. Runners should pre-register by March 17 to guarantee a T-shirt, she stated. Registration packets and late registration will be available at Heppner Elementary School between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. the day of the event. Runners will be bused out the Pilot Rock Highway to the starting points. The course follows Hinton Creek, through downtown Heppner to the City Park.
