

Mustangs down Weston-McEwen, advance record to 15-1

Dorian Forrar poured in a career high 39 points last Friday, as the Heppner Mustangs downed Weston-McEwen 76 - 67 to advance their record to 15 - 1 and assure themselves a place in the district playoffs.

"He just had a super night," Coach Dale Holland said of his standout 6'2" forward. Forrar's 39 points were the most scored by an individual Mustang this season.

Senior guard Don Lott also turned in a good performance in the Mustang win, Holland said, scoring 12 points and pulling in six rebounds.

Reserve guard Harry Groshens came off the bench to give the Mustangs a good game too. Groshens scored 11 points. "He handled the ball well and had a good game,"

said Holland.

The Mustangs stayed ahead of Weston-McEwen the whole game, mainly from managing a respectable 50 percent shooting average from the floor. Heppner made 27 of 54 shots attempted, while their opponents could muster only 27 of 70 shots put up.
