IUCC youth group completes Hungerthon

"We will not eat any food at all, no matter what happens, until 9 a.m. Sunday morning," These words began the Covenant signed by eleven youth and two advisors at the beginning of the Ione United Church of Christ Jr. High Youth Fellowship Hungerthon, stated the Rev. Cathy Barker. All of the participants completed the 24-hour fast, earning over \$350 from pledges. The entire amount will be sent to the Hunger Action Fund of the United Church of Christ, to be used for resources for agriculture, policy change, and emergency food aid both here in our own country and abroad, continued Barker.

During their time together, the youth involved viewed two filmstrips on hunger and discussed their learnings. Each kept a diary of how they were feeling and what they were learning from the experience and from the various activities of the day. The group made a montage of pictures and words from magazines to illustrate the problem of world hunger and some of the solutions. "There aren't any easy answers to these problems!" said one youth.

At 9 a.m. Sunday morning, the designated end of the fast, most of the hungry young people felt fine and eagerly ate the breakfast prepared by Gene and Maxine Rietmann, said Baker. Others were pale and weak, and found it hard to eat. The group discussed how terrible it would be to go without food indefinitely. "Everyone needs food!" exclaimed Tina Wilson of Ione.

Several of the Hungerthon participants shared their experience with the congregation in the worship service that morning. Those present were impressed by the commitment of the young people, and by the meaningful thoughts they shared, Barker said. "We've learned that we shouldn't be greedy and waste

Upon the question of levying a tax for the purpose of funding the school district budget.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT an election will be held March 30, 1982 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. The purpose of the election is to submit a tax levy to the voters for the purpose of funding the school district operating budget for the 1982-83 school year.

If this measure is approved \$3,740,364 of the taxes levied in the 1982-83 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$615,226 of the taxes will be totally funded by the local taxpayers without any partial state payment. The purpose of the entire amount to be voted upon is to provide funds for maintenance and operation of the school district which cannot be provided within the district's tax base of \$661,249. The total levy will result in an estimated tax rate of \$7.96 per \$1,000 of true cash value, exclusive of the tax for bonded indebtedness.

NOTICE OF MEASURE ELECTION COUNTY OF MORROW

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, March 30, 1982, an election will be held in MORROW County, Oregon. The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The following question shall be submitted to the qualified voters thereof: TAX LEVY OUTSIDE THE SIX PERCENT LIMITATION SHALL MORROW COUNTY LEVY \$2,835,300 OUTSIDE OREGON CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION FOR ALL COUNTY OPERATIONS DURING FISCAL YEAR 1982-83.

The purpose of this levy is to provide funds to balance the Morrow County operating budget and the Morrow County Hospital and Clinic budgets for 1982-83. The Morrow County tax base for 1982-83 will be \$413,473. This levy with anticipated receipts from all sources, will not finance expenditures for General Fund, Roads, General School Funds, Cities portion of Road Funds and operation of the Hospital and North Morrow County Clinic. Increases are due to inflation, existing labor contracts tied to cost of living and certain changes in hospital operations, plus 8 percent for uncollected taxes. The total levy will be \$3,238,773. If this measure is approved, \$2,583,056 of the taxes levied in the 1982-83 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$655,717 of the taxes levied will be totally financed
