

Mustangs lose heartbreaker to Enterprise, 57-55

"This game just came down to how the ball bounced," Heppner Mustang Coach Dale Holland said after his Mustangs lost a heartbreaker 57-55 to Enterprise last Friday in first round action of the regional basketball tournament in Pendleton.

"We played a good game," said Holland, who has coached the Mustangs to a fine 18-3 record this season.

The Enterprise game was close all the way, with neither team going up by more than six points.

But it all came down to the final six minutes of the ball game, when Heppner guard Don Lott went to the foul line for a one and one with Enterprise up by two points.

Lott missed the shot and the Mustangs were not able to score to tie the game.

"They were a quick team and they got us a couple of times on the fast break," said Holland, however, Enterprise didn't do anything that particularly bothered the Mus-

tangs. We lost the game at the freethrow line, said Holland, pointing out Heppner's 7 of 13 from the line as compared to Enterprise's 11 of 13. Everybody that played did well, said Holland, especially Lott, Robert Bier and Dorian Forrar.

"I'm disappointed we didn't win, but I'm not disappointed in our season," said Holland.

"We had an extremely fine season, winning 18 of 21 games. We had a super bunch of kids and I thought they did real well."

He said Heppner's record was one of the best in the state this year.
