On November 7, 1924, she was married to James McDaniel in Heppner. They farmed in Morrow County and Mrs. McDaniel taught in Hardman and at Alpine School. They then moved to Grant County, where they farmed at Ize. Later, they moved to Stayton, where Mr. McDaniel retired.

Mrs. McDaniel taught high school for 29 years, including 21 years at Stayton High School. She retired in 1963. In 1978 she moved to Beaverton, living there until her death. Mr. McDaniel preceded her in death at Stayton, in 1968. Mrs. McDaniel devoted her spare time to gardening, especially enjoying her roses.

Funeral services were held Friday, March 26, at the First United Methodist Church in Beaverton, with the Rev. Robert Benefiel officiating. Committal services were at Restlawn Memory Gardens, Salem.

She is survived by a sister, Hazel Bennett of Beaverton and several nieces and nephews, including Elvira Irby and Delsie Craber, both of Heppner.

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner handled the following calls during the past week:

DA's Report

Glenda Mae Solis, 35 of Boardman pleaded guilty to Driving with No Operators License in Irrigon Justice Court March 22, reported Morrow County District Attorney Ann Spicer. Solis was sentenced to pay a \$50 fine and \$130 in court costs. A Driving While Suspended charge was dropped, Spicer said.

Adam Tompkins, 21 of Irrigon was found guilty by jury March 24 in Irrigon Justice Court for attempting to elude a police officer. Tompkins was sentenced to pay a \$155 fine.

Paul Joseph Foelt, 19 of Boardman pleaded guilty to two indictments of First Degree Burglary and one indictment of Second Degree Burglary in Morrow County Circuit Court Monday, March 22, Spicer said.

Foelt was sentenced to six months in the Wasco County Jail and was ordered to make full restitution over \$2,000 total to all victims, said Spicer.

probation was revoked for Charles Forest Ferguson, 29 of Milton-Freewater in Morrow County Circuit Court for committing theft while on probation. Ferguson was originally sentenced to three years probation on March 21, 1981 for First Degree Theft.

He was sentenced to a new period of probation for three years, must seek alcohol treatment with antabuse, no use of alcohol and must not enter any establishment, other than a grocery store where alcohol is sold. Ferguson was returned to Crook County for sentencing on the recent theft indictment, Spicer said.

Dennis Michael Harmon, 35 of Boardman was found guilty by jury March 15 in Irrigon Justice Court for Driving While Suspended. He was sentenced to pay a \$310 fine.

Raymond Vaughn Curnutt, 24 of Ione pleaded guilty to charges of Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle in Morrow County Circuit Court on Monday, March 22. He is awaiting pre sentencing and will be sentenced in about six weeks, Spicer said.
