Bacteriological Standards Exceeded in the City of Heppner Water Supply

The City of Heppner reports that the water supply failed to meet Federal bacteriological standards during April 1982. Analysis of monthly drinking water samples indicated that the April sample was positive for coliform organisms and that his result exceeded the limit allowed by law. The coliform organism is used as an indicator of microbiological quality, and while these organisms pose no threat to health, their presence does indicate that a source of contamination might exist somewhere in the water system. An investigation by the City was initiated as soon as the positive sample was reported. Chlorination was immediately instituted and subsequent samples are being taken daily.
