IHS thinclads compete at Umatilla, boys finish 1st, girls 3rd

The Cardinal thinclads traveled to Umatilla on Tuesday, April 27. The Cardinal boys finished first with 72 points, and the girls finished third with 19 points.

First places for the boys were recorded by Denny Starr in the discus with a toss of 119'10" and first in the javelin, with a throw of 149'4". Patton in the high jump with a leap of 5'8"; Craig Hams in the triple jump with a leap of 37'2"; Mike Douglas in the 1,500 meters in 4:42.01 and in the 3,000 meters in 10:17.59. Another double winner for the Cardinals was Donnie Taylor in the high hurdles in 18 seconds and in the intermediate hurdles in 45.93. The Cardinals 400 meter relay

team consisting of Howard Leavitt, Craig Hams, Jeff Hams and Donnie Taylor took first in a time of 47.75.

Second places were recorded by Craig Hams in the long jump with a leap of 19'9 1/2"; Taylor in the high jump with a jump of 5'2"; Leavitt in the triple jump with a leap of 35'5"; and Jeff Hams in the 400 meters in a time of 55.38.

Third places were brought in by Jeff Hams in the long jump with a leap of 19 feet; Starr in the triple jump with a jump of 34'4 1/2"; Patton in the 1,500 meters with a time of 4:47.96 and in the 800 meter run in 2:23.2; and Leavitt in the 400 meters in a time of 56.63. The only other third place win was by the 1,600 meter relay team consisting of Donnie Doherty, Scott Barnett, Jay Love, and Mike

Douglas. Fourth place finishes were recorded by Starr in the 800 meters in 2:35.12; Craig Hams in the 200 meter dash in 25.15; and Randy McCabe in the high hurdles in 20.66.

For the girls, Margaret Doherty had two firsts, one in the 400 meters in 65.48 and in the 200 meter dash in 27.04. Doherty also placed second in the long jump with a leap of 14'11" and second in the 100 meter dash in 13.19.

Michelle LaRue placed third in the discus with a throw of 75'3" and fourth in the javelin with a toss of 70'3".

Team scores for the boys were Ione 72, Riverside 47, Umatilla 45 and Stanfield 17. Team scores for the girls were Umatilla 56, Stanfield 45, Ione 19 and Riverside 18 points.

Heppner tracksters display super efforts

Tuesday, April 27, Sherman Co. was the sight of the Heppner track teams' display of what Coach Dale Conklin called "some super dupe efforts." Heppner journeyed to Sherman Co. to compete in a five way track meet that also included Wahtonka, Sherman Co., Condon, and Wasco Co.

Team scores for the girls were Wahtonka 68 1/2, Sherman Co. 56 1/2, Heppner 54, Condon 20, and Wasco Co. 19. Heppner girls missing second by only 2 1/2 points. The closeness of the girls' score in Coach Conklin's opinion was, "The most satisfying event of the whole track meet."

High scorer for the girls was Stephanie Payne with 13 1/2 points, followed by Pam Orr with 12 1/2 points. Payne received two firsts, one in the 100 in 13.42 and another in the 200 in 28.72, plus she earned points by being on Heppner winning 400 meter relay team. Pam Orr received a first in the shot

put, setting a new school record with her tremendous heave of 31'5". She also received two third placings, one in the 400 and another in the 300.

Other first place finishes for the girls included Lisa Wilson taking a first in the 3,000

meters with a time of 13:48.48 and Anne Murray throwing the javelin 86'11 1/2".

clearly set with Wahtonka taking first place with 108 1/2 points followed by Sherman Co. 98 1-3, Condon 24, Heppner 23, and Wasco Co. 15. High point scorer for the boys was

Wes Marlatt, who, tied for first place in the discus with a throw of 108'6" and earned a third place in the shot put. Marlatt received nine points for the boys' team. Other achievements for the boys

included a javelin throw by Sid Kennedy of 145'11", a

personal best for him, and a third place finish by Duane Garret in the pole vault with a leap of 10'6", also a personal best.

Conklin stated he was very pleased with the results. "The team as a whole is really improving and I expect they will go far by the end of the year," he said.
