Greg Jones placed second in the 1,200 meter run, second in the 800 meter run and third in the shot put. Jerry Anderson placed fifth in the 400 meter run. Alex Lindsay took second in the 100 meter dash and second in the long jump. Scott Buschke won fourth in the shot put and Jason Palmer won second in the discus. The boys' medley relay team placed third.

HHS golfers squeak by Riverside, place first

The Heppner boys' golf team was able to squeak by the Riverside boys' team at a golf meet at Willow Creek Country Club, Thursday, April 22, by four strokes. At the same meet, the Heppner girls were edged by five strokes, 210 to 215.

Medalist for the Heppner boys was again Don Lott, who carved out a 65 on one of the nicest spring days for golf so far said Heppner coach Duane Neiffer. Tied for girls medalist was Lorri Day with a 48 for nine holes.

On Saturday, April 24, the boys' team traveled to Mac Hi for a Mac Hi Invitational. Heppner placed second, ahead of Enterprise, but behind Mac Hi Medalist for the tournament was Randy Dodd of Mac Hi, who carded a 62 on the par 36 Mac Hi course. Low for Heppner was again Don Lott with a 73.

The Milton Freewater course is similar to Heppner's but some of the overhanging trees presented some real challenges to the Heppner boys, said coach Neiffer. The Heppner boy's junior varsity team also competed, being led by Darrell Miles with an 81

HHS girls take 1st for 1st time

School records and personal bests were established last Saturday in track action, but more importantly for the HHS girls, the meet was a first. The first recorded, was a tie for first place in a Umatilla Invitational track meet.

"This is the first time in the history of Heppner High School, the girls' team has finished in first," said coach Dale Conklin. "Girls' teams in the past have earned as high as second and third, but never a first. And we are getting a trophy to prove it."

The record book for the Heppner tracksters had hardly been closed from last Tuesday's track meet when the Heppner girls went to work again on Saturday.

Pam Orr bettered her Tuesday mark in the shot put by earning a 32'7" throw on Saturday, and continued her record setting ways by lowering her own mark in the 300 meter hurdles to :50.3, six-tenths of a second better than a week ago. She capped off the day's performances in leading the Heppner 1,600 meter relay team to a :32.6 clocking, five seconds better than Tuesday's outing. Rounding out the foursome were Stephanie Payne, Mary Kincaid and Jodi Padberg.

Padberg eclipsed her mark set a week ago in the 3,000 meters with an 11:59.5, running three seconds faster than before.

The 400 meter relay team of Janelle McElhany, Padberg, Orr and Payne set the fastest pace in the district to date with a :53.2, running for a first place finish and only three-tenths of a second off the school record.

Other outstanding efforts included an :18.3 running of the 100 meter high hurdles by McElhany and a 4'10" leap by Kincaid in the high jump.

Heppner boys collected a pair of third place finishes as Sid Kennedy threw the javelin 144'3" and Duane Garrett pole

coiled 10'6". Jeff Orr established a new personal record with a 5'8" mark in the high jump, good for fourth place, and was fifth in the long jump. The boys 400 meter relay team of Archie Lucas, Jeff Orr, Greg Orr and Sid Kennedy placed sixth with a :49.3 clocking.

Heppner tracksters were hard at work this past week preparing themselves for a District 7-A meet to be held in Umatilla on Friday and Saturday afternoons. Competition gets underway at 12:30 p.m. on Friday and will resume at 12 noon on Saturday.

The first and second place finishers at the district meet will automatically qualify for the state class A meet to be held in Portland, May 14-15, along with anyone who meets a qualifying standard.

"We aren't going to blow any chances of qualifying someone for the state meet by trying to win the district meet. The girls and I talked it over last week and the kids decided trying to qualify for the state meet was more important. Besides, we may not have had the depth to win district this year. But, wait a year or two," coach Conklin said.
