Swim Team hires coach, sets schedule

In preparation for the 1982 swim season, parents of Heppner Swim Team members have hired Tim Birkby, 26, to coach the swimmers. Mr. Birkby, a three-year resident of Heppner, teaches sixth grade at Heppner Grade School. His swimming career began in Prineville where he swam for seven years as a student in junior and senior high school. Mr. Birkby is certified in lifesaving and has taught first aid, said a spokesperson.

In further preparation for the summer, Gary Bruch, president of the Heppner swim club, attended a district meeting in Hermiston last Saturday. Representatives of all the Eastern Oregon Swim District clubs met to discuss the meet schedule, the spokesperson said.

Heppner will host two dual meets in July, one with Milton-Freewater and one with Hermiston. The club has also been invited to a dual meet at Milton-Freewater. These will be Wednesday evening meets. Other meets that the Heppner team will participate in are weekend invitationals at Hood River, The Dalles, Hermiston, Pendleton and John Day.

Swim Team practice will begin in mid-June and the season will end in mid-August with the district finals at Pendleton.
