

Heppner Hotel nominated to historic register

The Heppner Hotel building, owned by Arnie and Rita Hedman of Heppner, has been nominated to the National Register of Historic Places. The Heppner Hotel is one of 17 sites in Oregon nominated to the register, according to a news release from the Oregon Department of Transportation, Parks and Recreation Division. The nominations will be considered at a June 4 meeting of the State Advisory Committee on Historic Preservation, the news release stated.

"Bees and the Worlds of Art" was the topic of the essay composed by the Heppner sixth grade school student. She is in her second year of 4-H with projects in clothing, foods, and horsemanship. In her essay, the young writer described how bees and their products have been used in many different art fields. "from the art of candlemaking to the art of making movies." Beeswax has been used not only to make candles, but also to form jewelry molds, modeling wax and lithographic inks, she discovered in her research. Beeswax is used also on the bows of stringed instruments.
