The Heppner Fire Department arrived at the scene and found that the blaze had already been extinguished by Eucon employees. Roberts

said it took a maximum of 10 minutes to put out the fire.

Ken Hunziker, project engineer for Eucon, said the fire started when "electrical malfunction... caught wiring and hydraulic lines on fire.

Roberts said the fire is being investigated by a Eucon safety engineer.

Another truck was to be brought in, and in the meantime, Eucon has another truck on standby, Roberts said.
