Annuals and thier uses topic of Ione Garden Club

Annuals and Their Uses was the subject of discussion presented by Dorothy Burcham at the June 9 meeting of the Ione Garden Club. Hostesses were Norma Rea and Joyce Buchanan.

According to a club spokesperson, many gardeners are confused about whether a plant is a perennial, biennial or annual. An annual is a plant that completes its life cycle in a year or less. A seed germinates and the plant grows, blooms, sets seed and dies - all in one growing season. If one buys annual plants it is better to choose smaller ones rather than the large blooming ones, the spokesperson advised. Gardeners must make sure the plants do not dry out before planting, she continued. Most annuals will reseed themselves if the blossoms aren't cut off before seeding occurs. The expression, "grow as an annual" or "treat as an annual" means to plant the organism in the spring after the last frost, enjoy it from spring through fall, and then pull it out or let the frost kill it at the end of the year. Some common annuals are larkspur, calendula, petunias, zinnias, status, bachelor's buttons, sweet peas, verbena, nasturtiums, glyssum, ageratum, cosmos, gallardia, impatiens, protulaca, salvia, marigolds, stock, Iceland poppy, and candytuft.
