NEWS OF HEALTH

Hay fever afflicts some 15 million Americans. Many view it as a trick of fate and just sneeze and bear it. However, recent medical findings reveal that to forgo treatment can lead to much worse conditions.

"If left untreated, hay fever (allergic rhinitis) can progress to inflammation or infection of the sinuses, or even asthma," states Philip Norman, M.D., professor of medicine at Johns Hopkins University and chief of the Johns Hopkins Allergic Diseases Center at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Baltimore.

Ragweed (genus *Ambrosia*) is probably the most common cause of hay fever in this country, primarily because of the large number of persons who are sensitive to it and also because of the enormous volume of ragweed pollen that contaminates the air during the late summer and fall.

"It should not be taken lightly; it's a disease that deserves medical attention," Dr. Norman asserts.
