Teresa Barker, Beaver Creek, won the judging contest in the FFA division; Jeff Reagan and Shannon Whitley, both of North, tied for first in the 4-H division; and Ken and Sandy Coleman of Turner won the adults division.

Income tax withholding to change July 1

Oregon workers may notice a change in the amount of tax withheld from their paychecks after July 1. State income tax withholding will increase on that date, while federal withholding decreases, announced the Oregon Department of Revenue.

Despite the increase in state withholding, most wage earners will end up with more take-home pay. The reduction in federal withholding will more than offset the increase in state withholding, said the department.

An example is a couple with one working spouse who earns \$30,000 annually, filing a joint return and claiming two exemptions. The wage earner's state withholding each month would increase by \$16, from \$149 to \$165, while federal withholding would drop by \$44,

from \$116 to \$30, the department explained.

Changes in the state withholding resulted from a legislative session early this year dealing with the state's budget problems. The first special session of the Oregon Legislature increased tax rates for 1982. The previous range of four to 10 percent was increased to 4.2 to 10.8 percent. The legislature directed the Oregon Department of Revenue to adjust state withholding rates to reflect the tax increase.

The Oregon Department of Revenue has sent new withholding tax tables and reporting forms to employers. Employers will calculate the changes in withholding for each employee; employees do not need to take any action, the department concluded.

Extension Service offers new publication

"Losing one's job is never pleasant, but there are steps to be taken which can lessen the shock on the individual and family," points out Dawn C. Hawkins, Oregon State University agent in Umatilla and Morrow counties.

"Don't panic, don't blame yourself or your spouse, and don't ignore the fact of unemployment. Start to make plans immediately to find another

job and how you will manage until you find new employment," Mrs. Hawkins stresses.

To help people do just that, the OSU Extension Service offers the publication "What To Do If You Lose Your Job," which outlines some basic steps to take, and lists suggestions for action in the face of reduced income. The circular was prepared by Alice Mills Morrow, Extension family

economics and public policy specialist.

Included in the publication is a list of non-profit Consumer Credit Counseling Services in Oregon which are available to help individuals and families deal with credit problems.

Copies of the publication are available at the OSU Extension Service offices in Heppner, Pendleton, Hermiston and Milton-Freewater.

(This is a Limited Warranty)

All New Passenger tires and retreads listed on the attached invoice are covered by the LES SCHWAB SERVICE AND WARRANTY CONTRACT and will be given service or remedied under this warranty upon presentation of this contract at any Tire Center listed on the reverse side hereof.

- ROAD HAZARD: If a tire that has been run flat or punctured and repaired is returned to the store, it will be replaced at no charge to the customer.
- FREE FLAT REPAIR: Should the tire require retreading, no charge will be made. Original installation only.
- FREE TIRE REBALANCE: Tires will be rebalanced free of charge every 5,000 miles, or as needed to meet maximum tire weight. Rotation does not include wheel & bearing.
- FREE TIRE ROTATION: Tires will be rotated free of charge every 5,000 miles, or as needed to meet maximum tire weight. Rotation does not include wheel & bearing.
