

DA's Report

Sherri Gale Buschke, 24 of Walla Walla, Wash., charged June 28 with Second Degree Criminal Mischief and Assaulting a Public Safety Officer, pleaded guilty to both charges on July 15 in Morrow County Justice Court (Heppner), reported a spokesperson from the Morrow County District Attorney's office.

She was sentenced to pay a \$525 fine and a six month jail sentence - all suspended but \$207 of the fine on the condition that she comply with the following conditions of probation for one year: must reimburse Morrow County \$118 for damage to door in sheriff's office; must not consume alcohol during probation period; must participate in a professional counseling program until released by the treatment facility and must pay treatment expenses; shall not have any further violations of criminal law during her probation period.

For the Assaulting a Public Safety Officer charge, she was sentenced to serve 30 days in the Umatilla County Jail - all but seven days suspended; and was fined \$207.

In other news, the spokesperson reported:

- Michael Richard Buschke, 23 of Walla Walla, charged June 28 with Second Degree Criminal Mischief, pleaded guilty to the charge on July 15 in Morrow County Justice Court (Heppner).

He was sentenced to pay a \$525 fine and a six months jail sentence - all suspended but \$207 of the fine upon the condition that he comply with the following terms of probation for one year: must reimburse Morrow County \$255.09 for damage to a Morrow County sheriff's vehicle; must not consume alcohol during his probation period; must participate in a professional counseling program until released by the treatment facility and must pay treatment expenses; shall have no further violations of criminal law during his probation period.

- Charles Andrew Vandetta, 37 of Heppner, was found not guilty by jury of Disorderly Conduct on July 14 in Morrow County Circuit Court.

- Edward Joseph Marick, 39 of Stanfield, charged with two counts of Driving While Suspended, pleaded guilty to one charge and was sentenced to 60 days in jail - suspended on the condition that he give 24 hours community service.

- Juan Jose Navarro-Medina, 23 of Boardman, was found to be a habitual traffic offender on July 14 in Morrow County Circuit Court and is prohibited from operating a motor vehicle in the state of Oregon for 10 years.

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County sheriff's office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner handled the following calls and cases during the past week:

On July 15, the Heppner Fire Department responded to a vehicle fire at the Morrow County Fairgrounds at 6:25 p.m.

Also on July 15, a Heppner ambulance responded to the Eucon batch plant at the Willow Creek Dam site at 9:26 p.m. for a man who had reportedly fallen and had a possible back injury.

In a third July 15 incident, Theodore Roy Enders, 32 of Boardman, was arrested by Boardman Police and charged with alleged Menacing.

On July 16, the Heppner Fire Department responded to a brush fire near the cemetery at 8:49 a.m.

In a second July 16 incident, the Boardman Fire Department responded to a fire at the C & D Drive-In, Boardman.

Also on July 16, a Boardman ambulance transported a male patient from U & I Inc., Boardman, to Consolidated Good Shepherd Hospital, Hermiston.

In a fourth July 16 incident, a Morrow County Sheriff's deputy took a report from a 10 year-old boy who reported being assaulted by two unknown males who jumped out of a vehicle, took him off his bike, threw him to the ground and then threw his bike into a ditch. The suspects reportedly then drove off in the vehicle with two other suspects.

On July 17, Pablo Ponce of Boardman reported that two men had kidnapped his daughter, Julia Ponce, 21 at Patterson-Ferry Road. She was later returned to Boardman.

On July 18, two Morrow County Sheriff's deputies assisted in the arrest of Antonio Mendoza, 34 of Boardman. Mendoza is a suspect in the kidnapping of Julia Ponce. He was lodged at the Umatilla Police Department.

In another July 18 incident, an armed robbery occurred at Brown's Truck Stop, Irrigon at 2:15 a.m. The suspect was a black male armed with a small caliber revolver. He reportedly told the attendant to lay down on the floor and then took approximately \$1,700 in cash and checks.

Two local cowboys, Clay West of Ione and Jim Ward of Heppner, took top awards at the Elgin Stampede last Sunday.

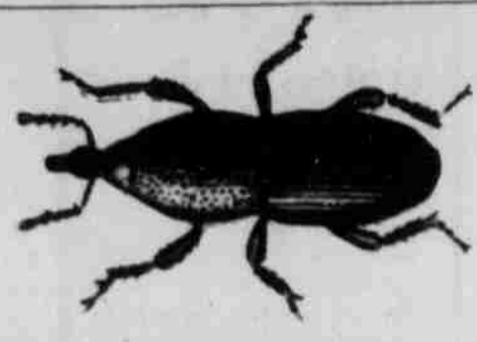
West won first place in steer wrestling and Ward took second in team roping.
