Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Department office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner handled the following reports and cases during the past week:

On August 10, John Richard Barrett, 32, of Heppner, was arrested by a Heppner Police Department officer on a justice court bench warrant for failure to appear for a hearing on charges of alleged Driving While Suspended and Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants and a warrant from the Pendleton Police Department for allegedly Driving While Suspended.

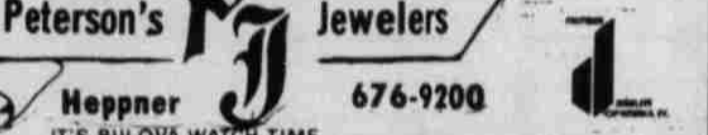
