Lilian C. Turner was a long time teacher in Morrow County and was very dedicated to her profession and in helping students to continue to further their education. At the time of her death, a bond was left for this purpose with hope that someone could continue to help this fund financially.

The foundation was organized and has continued to the

present. The bylaws have been changed, however, and now any Morrow County graduate or offspring of a Lilian C. Turner student is eligible to apply. The foundation asks that those students send to the foundation their mailing addresses and their dues; if they wish to remain on the mailing list. The dues are now three dollars.
