Contract 'A' shall consist of the construction of piers, abutments, paving, fencing, railing and incidental work as outlined in the scope of work for contract 'A' in the contract documents.

Contract 'B' shall consist of fabrication and transportation to site of precast bridge girders as outlined in the scope of work for the contract 'B' in the contract documents.

Contract 'C' shall consist of placement and installation of bridge girders, steel diaphragms and bearing pads as outlined in the scope of work for contract 'C' in the contract documents.
