## BMCC board sets tax base

A "compromise" tax base figure of \$3.4 million will be presented to the voters of Umatilla and Morrow counties Nov. 2, the Blue Mountain Community College board of directors decided at their September 21 meeting, said a college spokesperson.

Prior to setting the tax base figure, the board met in special joint session with the college budget committee. The two bodies wrestled with the dilemma of placing the tax base sufficiently high so the college could conceivably live within it for several years versus the necessity of keeping the tax base low enough to get voter approval, she explained.

The resulting compromise figure is \$300,000 above the 1982-83 operating levy approved by voters last March. Blue Mountain Community College operates without a tax base, and is required by state law to put the question of a tax base before the voters. District voters turned down the idea of a tax base for the college in 1980.

In another matter related to the November election, the board voted to oppose Ballot Measure 3, the one and one-half percent tax rate limit initiative. Preliminary figures show that the college would be limited to levying less than

half of its current tax levy for the operation of college programs.

In other business, the college board:

—heard from College President Ron Daniels that the board representatives and Faculty Association representatives will meet with a fact finder Wednesday, Sept. 29. College faculty members are in the process of negotiating 1982-83 salaries.

—named Mickey Barker, of Pilot Rock, to the college budget committee. She replaces Ida Reeser who decided not to seek re-appointment to another term on the board.

—hired Janice Chance to replace Jan Glasby in the nursing staff.

—accepted the low bid of St. Paul Insurance as carrier for college coverage. Package quote from St. Paul was \$28,588.

—learned that college registration is progressing smoothly for fall term and enrollment figures are about where they were last year.

## Absentee ballots available for November 2 election

Absentee ballot applications are available for the November 2 election at the Morrow County clerk's office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner. Registered voters may apply for the ballots if they will be unable to vote at a polling place on the day of the election. The absentee ballots must be returned to the clerk's office by 8 p.m. November 2, according to the 1982 voter's pamphlet.

An in state absent voter's application must be in writing and must include the voter's signature (for comparison purposes), a statement as to why the voter is unable to vote in person, a residence address and the address to which the ballot should be mailed, if different from the residence address.

If an elector is physically handicapped, the application is valid for every election held during the calendar year for which the application is received, the pamphlet states. A voter may apply for long term absent voter status with the county clerk or secretary of state if the person is a resident of Oregon absent from his or her place of residence; is serving in the Armed Forces or Merchant Marine of the U.S.; is temporarily living outside the territorial limits of the U.S. and the District of Columbia; or is a spouse or dependent of a long term absent voter. A spouse or dependent of a long term absent voter, not previously a resident of Oregon who intends to reside in the state, is considered a resident for voting purposes and may vote in the same manner as a long term absent voter, the Voter's Pamphlet explains.

A long term absent voter application must also be completed in writing; must

include the voter's name and current mailing address; must include a statement that the person is a citizen of the U.S.; a statement that the voter will be 18 years of age or older on the day of the election; a statement that his or her home residence has been in the state for more than 20 days preceding the election, along with the address of the person's last previous residence; a statement of the facts that qualify the person as a long term absent voter; a statement that the person is

not requesting a ballot from any other state and is not voting in any other manner than by absentee ballot; and a designation of political affiliation, if the voter wishes to vote in a primary election. Long term absentee ballot applications will be valid for all elections held within the calendar year for which they are received, the pamphlet states.

Special absentee voting instruction and a ballot return envelope will accompany each absentee ballot.
