A Cattle Conference, sponsored by the Umatilla County Cattlemen's Association and the Oregon State University Extension Service in Morrow and Umatilla counties will be held this Friday, Oct. 22, in Pendleton. The conference will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the Let 'Er Buck Room and is scheduled to conclude at 4 p.m.
