Police nab four in drug raid

Police arrested a Boardman family of four in a surprise drug raid in the wee hours of the morning on November 19.

After receiving a tip of alleged drug sales, Boardman Police set up a controlled drug buy November 18 at the Wilson Trailer Court and on November 19 arrested John Thomas Findley, 23 and Linda Ellen Findley, 22, husband and wife, and Elwyn Coy Findley, 52, and Helen Leatha Findley, 42, husband and wife, on charges of alleged delivery of controlled substance to a minor, delivery of a controlled substance for consideration, criminal conspiracy and possession of a controlled substance.

Boardman Police Sergeant Bill Hudson said that all \$70 of the marked money used by police in the operation, two cellophane baggies of marijuana and 50

tablets of amphetamines, known as "cross tops," were recovered in the buy. Hudson said the marked money was recovered from a suspect. He said a subsequent search of the two Findley residences revealed "quantities of marijuana packed for sale in quarter ounce baggies," amphetamines, and a hand gun. Charges are pending against Elwyn Findley for allegedly being an ex-confid in possession of a hand gun, said Hudson. Hudson said the street value of the confiscated drugs is not known.

Participating in the "bust," which Hudson said took around a week to set up, were Boardman Police Officers Bill Hudson, Bob Burford and Laddie Hancock, reserve officers Don Carlson and James Marquardt, and Morrow County Sheriff's Deputy Roy

Drago. Bail for father and son Elwyn and John Findley was set at \$50,000 each. Bail was set at \$20,000 each for Linda and Helen Findley. Elwyn, John and Helen were remanded to the Umatilla County Jail in lieu of bail and Linda Findley posted bail and was released. The four were arraigned at Irrigon Justice Court on November 22.
