

### Plan summer gardens now

For fresh home grown vegetables next summer, start planning your garden now. Planting varieties adapted to local conditions is one of the most important factors in a successful vegetable garden. With proper selection of varieties, gardeners can grow a wide range of garden fruits and vegetables in central Morrow County.

An important consideration in variety selection is the days to maturity. Most garden catalogs list the days to maturity right after the variety name. For warm season crops such as cantaloupes, squash, tomatoes and peppers, select varieties that mature quickly.

For lettuce, plant early in the spring and select varieties that are slow to bolt and that hold well in warm weather.

If a gardener has favorite varieties that have done well previously, he should stick with them for main plantings. Gardeners can call or stop by the extension office in Heppner for advice on suitable vegetable varieties.

Select suitable varieties and order seeds now. Vegetable seeds can be ordered from garden catalogs or bought at garden supply stores.

CHANGES ARE MADE IN DETERMINATIONS OF CITY OF HEPPNER, OREGON BASE FLOOD ELEVATIONS AND ZONE DESIGNATIONS UNDER THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM.

On April 1, 1981, the Federal Emergency Management Agency identified Special Flood Hazard Areas in the City of Heppner, Oregon, through issuance of a Flood Insurance Rate Map.

The Associate Director, State and Local Programs and Support, has determined that modification of the zones and elevations of the flood having a one-percent chance of occurrence in any given year (base flood) for certain locations in the City of Heppner is appropriate. The modified base flood elevations and zone designations, amend the Federal Emergency Management Agency Flood Insurance Rate Map for the community.

The changes are made pursuant to Section 206 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (P.L. 93-234), and are in accordance with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, P.L. 90-448), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR Part 65.

The changes in base flood elevations is as follows:
