

Extension slates regional programs for farmers

A number of regional programs of interest to farmers and ranchers will be held in the next few weeks.

The Fieldmen's Breakfast is held at 6:30 a.m. on the first and third Wednesday of each month through September at Frasu's Restaurant in Hermiston. On March 2, Don Rydrich from the Pendleton Experiment Station will discuss herbicides for wheat. Rydrich's discussion will be of interest to irrigators, dryland wheat growers, and farm chemical dealers. The Fieldmen's Breakfast on March 16 will feature a discussion by Umatilla County Extension agent Fred Kerr on last year's tick epidemic and a look ahead to this year. This program will be of interest to livestock producers. The Fieldmen's Breakfast is sponsored by the OSU Extension Service office in Hermiston.

The Morrow County Soil & Water Conservation Dis-

trict will hold their annual meeting at the Lexington Grange Hall on March 1 beginning at 7:30 p.m. Paul Rasmussen from the Pendleton Experiment Station will be the featured speaker. Rasmussen will discuss wheat fertilization practices with reduced tillage.

A Conservation Tillage Symposium will be held at the Portage Inn in The Dalles on March 3 and 4. The two-day Symposium will feature the "State-of-the-Art" for conservation tillage in dryland wheat production.

The Oregon Wheat Commission will hold their annual research review on March 8 at the Portage Inn at The Dalles beginning at 9 a.m. The review provides an opportunity for Oregon State University researchers to give an update on their projects funded by the Wheat Commission.

All programs are open to the public. For more information, contact the OSU Extension Service office in Heppner.
