

IHS track team takes fourth at Morrow Co. Invitational

Led by Craig Hams, the Ione boys' track team finished fourth at the Morrow County Invitational on Saturday, April 9, with 61 points. Hams won the long jump, leaping 19'6 1/2", and the triple jump by leaping 40'6", setting a new school record in that event. The 400-meter relay team of Howard Leavitt, Don Taylor, Hams and Tim Patton placed fifth in 0:46.8. Other winners for the Cardinals were Patton in the high jump, going 5'10", and Denny Starr, throwing the discus 136'7". Patton also was fifth in the 100 meters, turning in a 0:12.1 time and placed sixth in the 200-meter dash in 0:24.5. Starr also tossed the javelin 152'1" but did not place.

Leavitt was fourth in the triple jump with 37'10 1/4"; sixth long jumping, 18'1 1/2"; and sprinted 0:56.8 in the 400 meters.

Hurdler Taylor got a second in the high hurdles in 0:18.0, plus running the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in a 0:45.4 clocking, and high jumping 5'2".

Randy McCabe got a sixth in the discus by throwing it 104' 1/2".

Distance runner Mike Douglas was fifth in the 3,000 meters with a time of 10:00.9. In the 1,500 meters Douglas ran 4:36.2, while Mark Meyers ran 4:51.6. Meyers ran a 2:18.2 for 800 meters.

Pole vaulters Darrin Padberg and McCabe did not clear opening height in the pole vault.

Throwers Don Doherty and Scott Barnett put the shot

37'6 3/4" and 29'6 3/4" respectively. Barnett also threw the javelin 109'4".

Freshman Brian Douglas, competing in the intermediate hurdles and the 800, had times of 0:48.3 and 2:16.8 respectively.

Ione will travel to Moro on April 16 for the 11 a.m. beginning of the Sherman County Invitational and then to the Condon five-way meet on April 19, which begins at 4 p.m.

HHS girls set new records

The Heppner girls' track team was edged out of first place by a strong Joseph girls team at the Morrow County Invitational track meet at Umatilla last Saturday, but the local thinclads turned in a strong effort by setting four school records and two meet records.

Joseph won the girls' competition with 96 points, followed by Heppner's 89, Enterprise 51, Weston-McEwen, 45, Wahtonka 30, Umatilla 26 1/2, Condon and Wasco County 26, Helix 22, Riverside 16, Stanfield 16, Arlington seven and one-half, Pilot Rock zero and Wheeler County zero.

The HHS 400-relay team of Tiffany Lawson, Jodi Padberg, Pam Orr and Stephanie Payne ran :52.8 to set a new school and meet record. The old school record was :52.9 set in 1977 by Jacki Mollahan, Louise Harrison, Tammy Lucas and Maureen Healy and the old meet record was 53:1 set by Pilot Rock in 1979, said Heppner Coach Dale Conklin.

Other place finishes included Orr, second in the javelin with 104-2; Anne Murray, fifth in the javelin at 86-11; Padberg, fourth in the 1,500 meters; and Melinda Eubanks, sixth in the shot put with 27-1 1/2. The boys were led by John Moyer who was third in the long jump with a 18-4 1/2 leap. He pulled a groin muscle while jumping and was unable to compete in the rest of the meet. Wesley Marlatt was sixth in the shot put. John Martin lowered his times for the 1,500 and 3,000 meters, but just missed placing. He ran 4:34.6 in the shorter run for seventh place overall out of the scoring and ran 10:24.8 in the longer race.

Douglas sets school record

One school record and many other fine results were achieved by the Ione thinclads on Tuesday, April 5 in a five-way meet at Umatilla against Heppner, Riverside, Stanfield and Umatilla. No team scores were kept at the meet.

Mike Douglas set a school record in the 1,500 meter, placing third in a time of 4:35.9 and breaking Todd Sherer's 1977 record of 4:36.6. He also won the 3,000 meters in 10:10.5 and ran on the 1,600-meter relay quartet with Don Doherty, Brian Douglas and Denny Starr who was fifth in 4:12.5.

Tim Patton and Craig Hams had equally impressive days. Patton won the high jump with a 5'10" mark and the 100 meters in 0:11.8. He also took second in the 200 meters (0:25.1), and ran the anchor leg on the winning 400-meter relay, which included Howard Leavitt, Don Taylor and

Hams, in 0:48.1.

Hams won the long and triple jumps, jumping 20'5" and 39'9" respectively. In addition to the relay, he was fourth in the 200, 0:25.8.

Two seconds and a third were registered by Don Taylor. In the high and intermediate hurdles times of 0:18.0 and 0:45.5 were good for second. Scaling 5'8", he was third in high jump.

Adding two more first places was Denny Starr, tossing the javelin 162'0" and the discus 131'1". He put the shot 37' 1/2" but did not place.

Howard Leavitt turned in thirds in the long jump, leaping 18'3 1/4"; in the triple jump with a mark of 37'10"; and was fourth with 0:57.3 in the 400 meters.

Getting a second in the shot put was Don Doherty, throwing 40'6". Also, he ran 0:14.0 in the 100 meters and long jumped 15'8 1/2".

Ione went 2-3 in the pole vault with Darrin Padberg vaulting 8'6" and Randy McCabe going 8'0". McCabe

finished third in the discus with 104'10" and fifth in the javelin, 109'0"; and threw 34 1/2" in the shot put.

Padberg dashed 0:28.5 in the 200 and hurdled the 300 meter intermediates in 0:54.5.

Earning two thirds, Brian Douglas had a 0:50.3 and a 2:20.1 clocking in the intermediates and 800 meters respectively.

Mark Meyers was fourth in the 800, running 2:20.4 besides long and triple jumping 16'10" and 33'10", which was good for sixth place.

Thrower Scott Barnett heaved the discus 94'0", the javelin 79'0", and the shot 31'4 1/2". Coach Gordon Meyers said one reason for the excellent performances was the good weather.

Ione will travel to Moro on Saturday, April 16, for the Sherman County Invitational beginning at 11 a.m., and to Condon on Tuesday, April 19, for a five-way meet beginning at 4 p.m.
