

Sheriff's Dept. considering reserve deputy program

The Morrow County Sheriff's Department is considering starting a reserve deputy program, announced Morrow Co. Sheriff Roy Drago. Reserves must be 21 years old and must be a resident of Morrow County. Reserve deputies will be required to

ride a minimum of 16 hours per month with a certified deputy, responding to a wide variety of radio calls including thefts, juvenile complaints and family disputes.

Applicants must have a good driving record and not have any criminal convictions.

Persons interested in becoming a reserve deputy are asked to contact the Morrow County Sheriff's Department at 676-9910 or 676-9006. A list will be compiled, and if enough interest is shown, a meeting will be scheduled at a later date, the sheriff said.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency gives notice of the proposed determinations of modified base (100-year) flood elevations, in accordance with Section 110 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (Pub. L. 93-234), 87 Stat. 980, which added Section 1363 to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (Pub. L. 90-448)), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR 67.4 (a).

These elevations, together with the flood plain management measures required by Section 60.3 of the program regulations, are the minimum that are required. They should not be construed to mean the community must change any existing ordinances that are more stringent in their flood plain management requirements. The community may at any time enact stricter requirements on its own, or pursuant to policies established by other Federal, State, or regional entities. These proposed elevations will also be used to calculate the appropriate flood insurance premium rates for new buildings and their contents and for the second layer of insurance of existing buildings and their contents.

Pursuant to the provisions of SUCS 605 (b), the Associate Director, to whom authority has been delegated by the Director, Federal Emergency Management Agency, hereby certifies that the proposed flood elevation determinations, if promulgated, will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small entities. A flood elevation determination under Section 1363 forms the basis for new local ordinances, which, if adopted by a local community, will govern future construction within the flood plain area. The elevation determinations, however, impose no restriction unless and until the local community voluntarily adopts flood plain ordinances in accord with these elevations. Even if ordinances are adopted in compliance with Federal standards, the elevations prescribe how high to build in the flood plain and do not proscribe development. Thus, this action only forms the basis for future local actions. It imposes no new requirement; of itself it has no economic impact.

Proposed base flood elevations along flood sources studied in detail are shown on the Preliminary Revised Flood Insurance Rate Map. Lessees and owners of real property in the City of Ione are encouraged to review these maps and related materials at the address cited above. The flood sources studied in detail are:

NOTICE OF COMPETITIVE BIDEEMPTION

The Morrow County Local Contract Review Board intends to declare an exemption from competitive bidding, as authorized by State statute and County ordinance.

On Wednesday, June 22, 1983, at 10:00 a.m., the LCRB will announce its intention to authorize Morrow County to purchase a portable jaw crusher from Cay Equipment Company, for \$47,000 plus a surplus portable crushing plant. It will also authorize the sale in trade of the surplus portable crushing plant to Cay Equipment Company.

Because the purchase has been twice previously subject to public bidding, without successful bids having been received, the LCRB finds that it is unlikely that such an exemption will encourage favoritism in the awarding of public contracts or substantially diminish competition for public contracts. Further, the LCRB finds that such an exemption will result in substantial cost saving to the County. Similarly, the sale will satisfy the same criteria.

Any member of the public is entitled to be heard on this exemption, and may request a public hearing thereon.
