**N.W. Irrigation Utilities propose new rates to B.P.A.**

Adoption of a proposed irrigation energy rate by Bonneville Power Administration would benefit the entire Northwest, according to Clark Brewington, chairman of Northwest Irrigation Utilities. The proposed rate adjustment would give the region's sagging agricultural industry a much needed assist and, in addition, would encourage further utilization of surplus power for irrigation. Brewington said BPA revenue from the additional sales would help hold down rates for all electricity users, he explained.

Northwest Irrigation Utilities is composed of 14 consumer-owned electric utilities in Washington, Oregon and Idaho, including Columbia Basin Electric Co-op in Heppner. The group has proposed that BPA, in its new rates to be effective Nov. 1, 1983, make power available for irrigation pumping at a seasonal off-peak rate. The proposed rate would reduce irrigation costs to customers of all utilities purchasing BPA power.

The proposed irrigation power rate has the support of numerous other electric utilities as well as agricultural interests throughout the Northwest. "The rate adjustment would recognize the off-peak nature of the irrigation load, which is heaviest in the spring and summer when electricity consumption in general is highest and there is a surplus of hydroelectric power," Brewington said.

From 1942 until 1974 BPA sold irrigation power at a lower rate for three reasons, he added. The special rate was phased out between 1974 and 1979 due to a dwindling power surplus. "Now, however, the region again faces a surplus of power which is expected to continue through this decade," Brewington pointed out. "Every effort should be made to market more of the surplus power and hold down the cost per kilowatt-hour for all Northwest consumers."

Farmers in Washington, Oregon, Idaho and western Montana irrigate nearly 8.5 million acres. Without irrigation much of this land would revert to desert and the remainder would be limited to lower yield, less diversified dryland farming. Many farmers have been cutting back on irrigation as a result of declining product prices and rising costs. This result in decreased power sales, despite the surplus, and forces BPA and local utilities to charge more per kilowatt-hour.

Northwest Irrigation Utilities has estimated that a 10 percent drop in irrigation energy sales would mean a loss of some \$11.8 million in BPA revenues. On the other hand, a 10 percent increase in sales as a result of the proposed rate adjustment would bring the agency an additional \$8.8 million in revenues.
