Road Report

The Morrow County Public Works Department has released the following Road Report:

Road work done in the Irrigon-Boardman area included: cold patching on Eighth Street west, Road No. 913, South Main-Kinkade, Peters and Boardman-Irrigon roads. Brush was cut and cleaned up along roadsides of Boardman-Irrigon, Irrigon-Frontage and Peters roads. Sand was cleaned off Irrigon Road No. 816 and Irrigon-Slaughter roads. Shoulders were built-up on Kunze Road and forms are being prepared for bridge work on Patterson-Ferry Road.

Roads that were bladed included: Dick Smith-McNabb west, Emma White and Wyland.
 The chip spreader and rolling and blading equipment are working on the M. Baker, Halvorsen and the north end of Ione-Gooseberry roads where gravel, oil and cold mix are being distributed for a new road surface.

Shoulders are still being widened as well as other shoulder work being done and gravel being spread on Pine City Road to Little Butter Creek Road.
 A new culvert was installed on Piper Canyon Road and a culvert extension added on Myers Road.

Roads receiving cold patching were: Jordan Grade, Pine City, Keck Canyon, Baseline, Ione-Boardman, Basey Canyon and west of Halvorsen Road.
