Heppner Elks Lodge gives \$870 to Elk's Children's Eye Clinic

A donation of \$49,213 has been given to the Elks Children's Eye Clinic by the Oregon State Elks Association; of the total, \$870 was donated by the Heppner Lodge, reports Tom Kruse of the Oregon Health Sciences University. The clinic is located at the Oregon Health Sciences University in

Portland. For 34 years, the Oregon State Elks Association has contributed to and provided major financial support for the clinic. This relationship between the Elks and the Department of Ophthalmology at University Hospital began in July, 1949, with the Establishment of the Elks

Children's Eye Clinic, the first of its kind in the nation, Kruse said.

Since that time, nearly 13 million has been given to the clinic by the Elks. The money is used both for the daily operation of the clinic and for the building fund to finance future expansion.

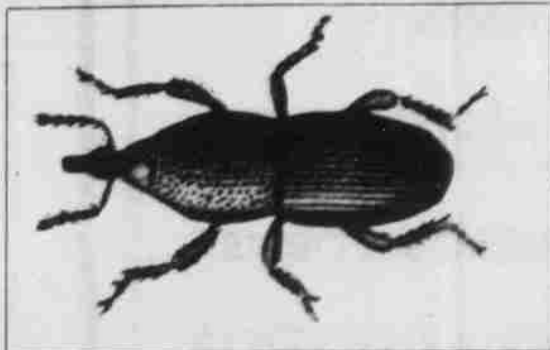
