Wallace C. Tykward

WHITEHALL, Mont. — Graveside services will be held Friday, July 29, at Heppner Masonic Cemetery for Wallace C. Tykward, 70, of Whitehall, Montana. Mr. Tykward died Monday, July 25, 1983, at Missoula, Montana.

He was born August 20, 1912 in McCook, Nebraska, the son of Frank and Nora Tykward. The family moved to Montana in 1916, where he attended school in Whitefish.

He moved to Alaska in 1937 to work as an electrician, and was married to Nora Putnam in 1960. In 1962, they came to Oregon. Mrs. Tykward died in Heppner in 1966.

Mr. Tykward retired in 1970 and had been a resident of Whitehall since then.

Survivors include a brother, Fred Tykward, of Whitehall; and two sisters, Vena Armstrong and Dorothea Gunderson, both of Missoula.
