

Crop Report

The Oregon Crop and Livestock Reporting Service has released the following Crop Report:
Oregon winter wheat production, based on conditions as of August 1, is estimated at 61.1 million bushels, one percent more than last year. A higher average yield more than offset a decline in acres for harvest this year. The

average yield of winter wheat is expected to be 63.0 bushels per acre compared with 55.0 bushels per acre harvested last year. Acres for harvest is estimated at 970,000 acres compared with 1,100,000 acres a year ago.
Spring wheat production was placed at 3.8 million bushels, four percent less than last year. All wheat produc-

tion amounts to 64.9 million bushels, just fractionally above last year's production. Nationally, all wheat production is forecast at 2.42 billion bushels, down 14 percent from the 1982 record high production.
Barley production in Oregon is estimated at 18.1 million bushels with an average yield of 67.0 bushels per acre,

highest yield on record. Production in 1982 totaled 14.1 million bushels with an average yield of 64.0 bushels per acre.
Other Oregon crops forecast as of August 1 are as follows: Oat production at 5.0 million bushels, 26 percent less than last year's; corn for grain production, 2.9 million bushels, 39 percent less than 1982;

alfalfa hay production, 1.9 million tons, 10 percent more than last year; all other hay production, 1.3 million tons, nine percent above 1982; hop production, 11.0 million pounds, 16 percent less than last year; sugar beet production, 292,000 tons, 16 percent above 1982.
The first forecast of the 1983 Oregon plum and prune pro-

duction is placed at 26,000 tons, down 13 percent from last year's 30,000 tons. Nationally, excluding California, the crop is estimated at 60,800 tons for 1983, two percent above the 1982 crop.
Bartlett pear production in Oregon is estimated at 76,000 tons, nine percent above last year. All other pears are

estimated at 120,000 tons, 14 percent above the 1982 crop. All pear production for the Pacific Coast is estimated at 783,500 tons, three percent above the 1982 crop.
Apple production in Oregon is expected to total 160 million pounds, seven percent higher than last year. Washington is expecting a 15 percent larger crop, while nationally, production is forecast at 8.4 billion pounds, three percent above the 1982 crop.

As of June 1, 1983, Oregon farms numbered 37,000 farms, a three percent increase from a year earlier. Meanwhile, Oregon's land in farms at 18.2 million acres remained unchanged from the last two years.
