No decision on arena use

The Boardman City Council, at their August 2 meeting, was once again embroiled in the controversy involving the rodeo arena located behind the Dodge City Inn, 100 First St. N.W., Boardman. The arena and Dodge City are operated by Jody Tatone and owned by his father Joseph.

The topic of the meeting was the appeal by neighbors of the arena of the ruling by the Boardman Planning Commission that the arena was a proper use for the area in which it was located.

That meeting took place on August 2 but the City Council, after three hours of testimony postponed ruling on the matter until they can review all of the material presented thus far.

They hope to make a ruling at the council meeting on September 13, but regardless of what they decide it is quite likely to be appealed to the State Land Use Board of Appeals.

'Econo-Eating'

Are you starting to feel buried in an avalanche of zucchini? There was a woman in the extension office the other day who wanted some new ideas for using up her summer garden produce. I finally asked her how many zucchini plants she had. I was just amazed. She had 13! Now my experience is that if you have even two plants it becomes a challenge to use them up. Thirteen! Talk about being buried! Needless to say I gave her what I thought was the best advice. Pull a bunch of the plants out. There is no point in prolonging the misery. One sharp pang of remorse for being wasteful and then a peaceful summer. Otherwise, she'd better set up her own roadside stand.

There are many ways to enjoy the summer abundance. If you've been gardening for a few years, you have probably settled into a routine of what the family will eat and how much to plant. If this is your first year or two, make some notes. You may think you'll remember how much you planted, but few of us do. If it's just about right, then you'll want to know that. If it's way too much, you're wasting the cost of the seed and water.

Here are a couple of recipes that may be useful in handling that zucchini avalanche. One is a pickle recipe that's like a bread and butter pickle. The other is my favorite, very simple recipe for broiling zucchini.

- Zucchini Pickles**
- 1 quart vinegar
 - 2 cups sugar
 - 1/4 cup salt
 - 2 teaspoons celery seeds
 - 2 teaspoons tumeric
 - 1 teaspoon dry mustard
 - 5 lb. s. (5 to 6 inch) zucchini, unpeeled, and cut into 1/2 inch slices. (About 10 zucchini)
 - 1 quart thinly sliced onions (4 to 5 medium sized onions)
- In a saucepan, combine vinegar, sugar, salt, celery seeds, tumeric and dry mus-

tard. Bring to a boil. Pour over zucchini and onions; let stand one hour, stirring occasionally. Bring zucchini mixture to a boil, simmer three minutes. Continue simmering while packing the jars one at a time.

Fill to within 1/4 inch of top, making sure that vinegar solution covers pickles. Use canning lids according to manufacturer's directions. Process in a boiling water bath immediately for five minutes for pints and 10 minutes for quarts after the water has returned to a rolling boil. Cool and check to be sure pickles have sealed.

Zucchini Parmesan
Wash zucchini; cut in half lengthwise. Wipe out side with a paper towel and then spread with soft margarine or butter. Place cut side up on baking sheet. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese, lightly spread to make it even on the cut surface. Sprinkle with a seasoned salt, if desired. Place 4 to 5 inches below broiling unit and broil until golden brown. Zucchini will still be crisp.
