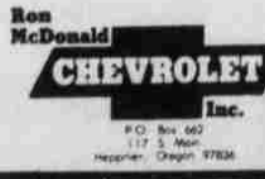
be at the center on Wednesday, Oct. 19, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon. Food stamp applications are available at the center during regular business hours.
