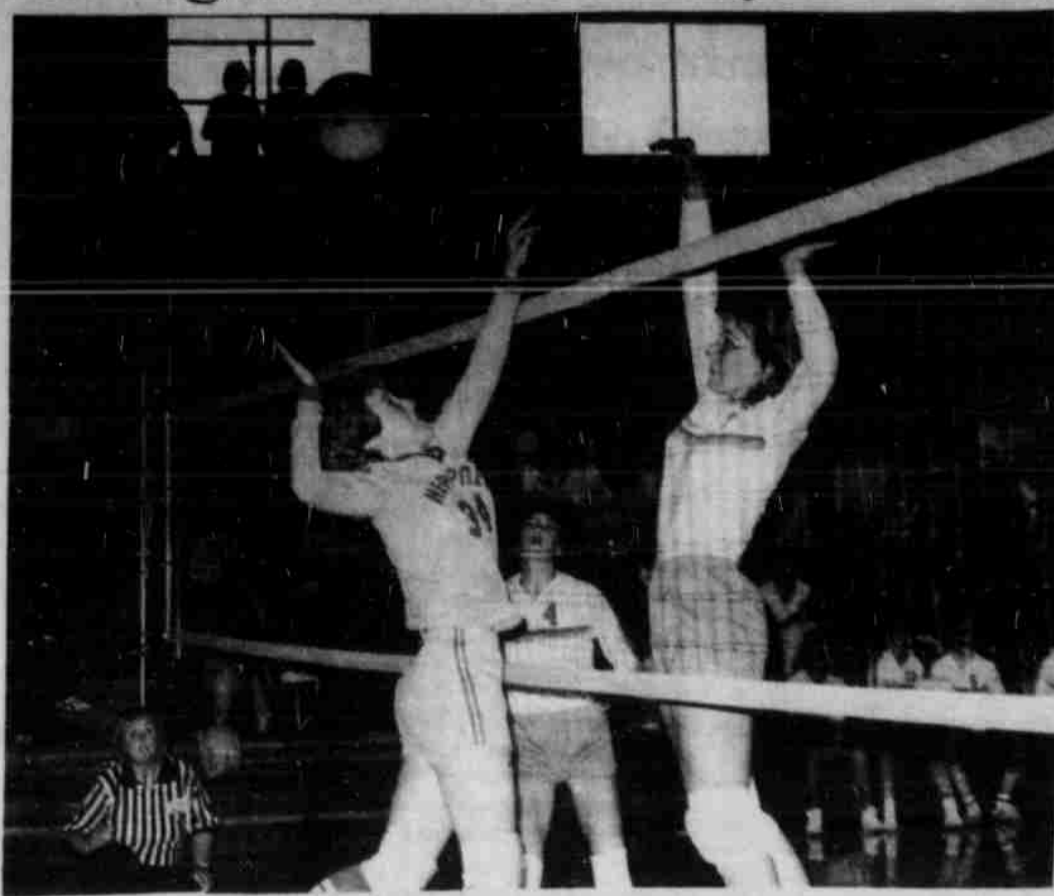


# Vikings takes win away from varsity Fillies 'C' team loses close one to Umatilla
