

Cards come on strong to defeat Wheeler Co. Falcons 48-22

Again the lone Cardinals had to use a strong fourth quarter to defeat a Big Sky Conference opponent, and this time, it was Wheeler County Falcons who fell 48 to 22 on Friday, Oct. 28.

Lone took the opening kickoff and Howard Leavitt broke loose for a 52-yard scamper for a touchdown.

The Falcons came right back on a 59-yard touchdown jaunt by quarterback Bob Thomas. Scott Marler ran for two putting Wheeler up 8-6.

Leavitt took it in three yards and following Jeff Ball's block
