Co. instructors trained for clothing program

Several Morrow Co. women recently attended a special training session on construction of children's clothing which was taught by Extension Textile and Clothing Specialist Ardis Koester. Juanita Ryan of Irrigon, Jean Brazell of Lexington, Ruth McCabe, Ione, and Birdine Tullis of Ione attended. The purpose of the training was piloting a very new program which will be offered in Oregon next year. Others attending the "pilot" or test training session were from Umatilla and Grant counties, along with Extension Agents Dawn

Hawkins and Elaine Husted. Presently, plans are underway to offer a preview of a children's clothing workshop in Morrow and Umatilla counties during January. Those interested may then choose to attend future sessions on children's clothing which will be offered in various locations and will include beginning, intermediate and advanced sewing skills. Local group to take part in Christmas Bird Count

On December 21, the Heppner High School Biology Three Class will head the Ruggsd-Hardman annual Christmas Bird Count, which will be one of 1,500 similar counts taken from Hawaii to Labrador, and from Alaska to Venezuela, during the period of December 17 to January 2. This year marks the 84th anniversary of the original count: taken on Christmas Day, 1900, by a group of birdwatchers in 25 locations, mostly around major north-eastern cities. Since then the annual event has grown from its original 25 to 1,500 counts,

and the total participants from 27 to 1,500 counts, and the total participants from 27 to well over 35,000. This year every Canadian province, every American state, many Central American countries, and numerous West Indies islands will submit their results to the National Audubon Society, which supervises the affair and publishes all the data in its journal, "American Birds." Mustangs place 2nd in tourney

The Heppner Mustangs gave it all they had Saturday night, but came up short in the final game of the Morrow County Invitational with a 48-38 loss to the Riverside Pirates.

But how they got there is another story. Friday night they came from behind to defeat the Mohawk Indians 69-64. One way to sum up the win was the amount of free throws Heppner made, 27 for 50. Greg Orr was 11 for 19 from the line and led all scorers with 27 points and eight rebounds. After an even first quarter (17-17), Mohawk jumped out to a 35-27 lead at halftime.

The Mustangs, however, came out pumping in shots but couldn't control the outside shooting of Mohawk and were down by 11 going into the fourth quarter. From there Orr and Thompson took over as Heppner out-scored Mohawk 25-9 in the final period and took the 69-64 win. Eric Thompson contributed 12 points with excellent free throw shooting.

Heppner found out earlier who they were going to play when Riverside defeated Embler 59-55. Saturday night the battle was on.

The Mustangs started out well, playing with a lot of hustle, going all out against

arch rival Riverside and took a 13-10 lead in the first quarter.

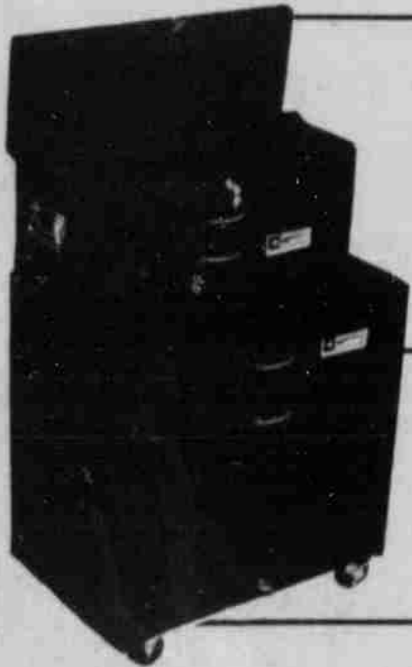
The second quarter wasn't as good as the Pirates out-scored Heppner 14 to 3 as they led at the half 24-16. The Pirates kept up their relentless attack throughout the second half and won 48-38.

Eric Thompson led the scoring for the Mustangs with nine points and four assists. While Kelly Seel and Tyler Trumbull had 10 points for the Pirates.

Heppner Coach Brent Eggers commented, "I think we could play a lot better but it wasn't bad for our first weekend."

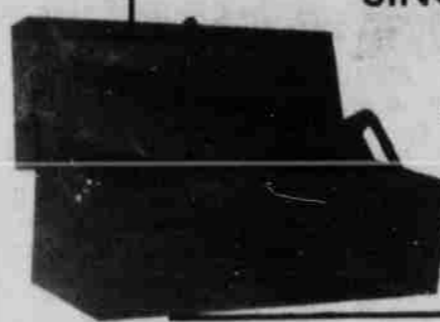

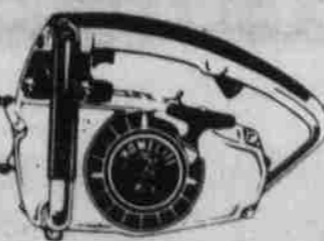
