

## Mustangs edge Grant Union 39-37 in overtime

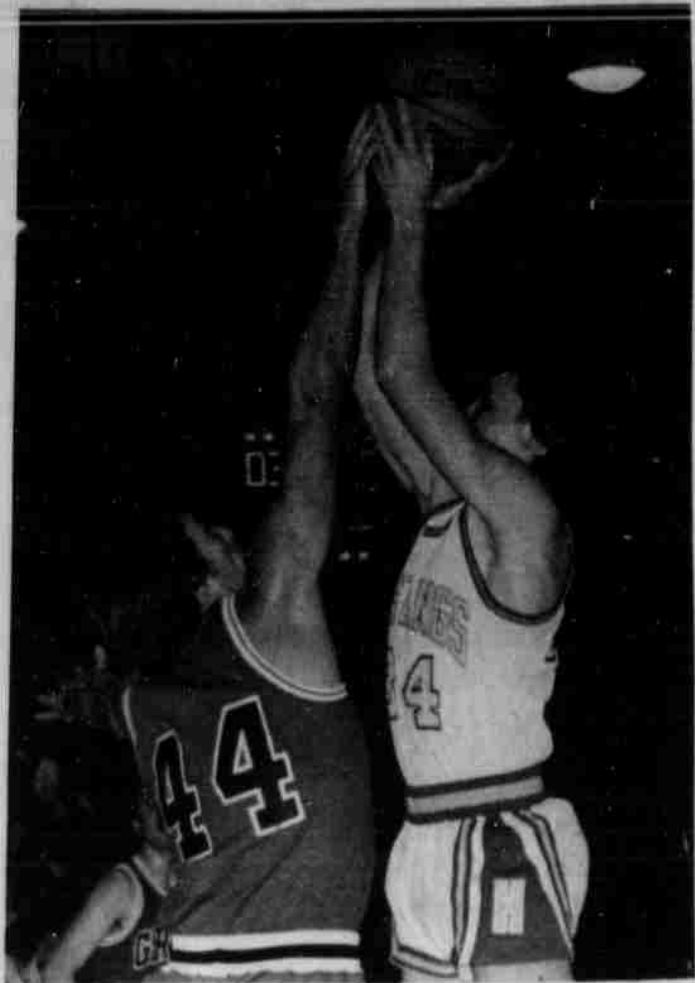

Grant Union could only capture eight points in the quarter and the game was tied at halftime 14-14.

The third quarter had a faster pace with Grant Union out-scoring Heppner 16-13. However, the Bulldogs were in serious foul trouble going into the fourth quarter.

Led by the clutch shooting of

side Pirates 64 to 48 on Saturday, Dec. 10. Ione dropped to 2-2.

Ione started the game in fine fashion taking a first period lead of 12-10. Mark Meyers had six for the Cardinals and Darrin Padberg four. Pirate center Tyler Trumbull had 10 points.

Riverside out-scored the Cardinals 14 to 11 and took a halftime lead of 24-23 over Ione.

The Pirates scored 24 third quarter points to 13 for Ione to increase their lead to 48-36. Randy McCabe scored eight in the quarter. Trumbull and Dang Pratt had six each for Riverside.

In the fourth quarter Riverside coasted home to the win, outscoring the Cards 16-12 to win 64 to 48.

Ione made 20 of 46 field goals connecting on 44 percent of their shots. The Cardinals were 8 of 19 from the charity stripe, 42 percent. Riverside made 28 of 61 field goals for 46 percent. At the free throw line they were 8 of 25 for 32.

McCabe and Meyers led th Ione scoring attack with 17 and 14 points respectively. Trumbull led Riverside with 20. Mark Stevens and Kelly Secl added 12 and 10 respectively.

The Cardinals played Riverside at home on Tuesday, Dec. 13. They then play Wheeler Co. on Friday, Dec. 16 at home and travel to Heppner on Saturday, Dec. 17.

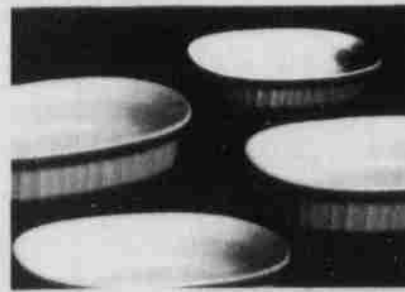

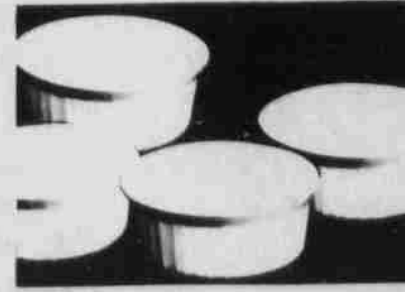
